"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it." Matthew 16:24-25

This familiar passage comes from a conversation that Jesus was having with his disciples about what following him was about. After spending some time with Jesus, hearing what he said and seeing the amazing things that he did, they began to get rather inflated egos, and, of course had dreams of glory about their future with him. They were upset when he began to talk about his eventual suffering and death, Peter even scolding him -- that couldn't happen to the Messiah.



Here Jesus outlines for them what it really means to follow him; service and sacrifice, no simply belief, saying that he came not for earthly glory and praise, but to help, to serve and to heal and to give of himself for others. There were no selfish motives behind what Jesus did. To follow didn't simply mean that you acknowledged that he was the Son of God. To **really** follow meant doing as he did, sacrificing as he did which was a bit frightening for the disciples.

What can make us a bit uncomfortable is that Jesus wasn't talking just to them, but is also talking to us, reminding us that to follow him there are certain expected behaviors and beliefs that we must live by. And yet, in our society it is all too easy to call oneself a Christian because we believe that Jesus was the Son of God and died for us without the real dedication of what it means to follow. How many Christians today think of themselves as disciples as opposed to simply being Christian? Maybe many don't because of the high bar of expectations that seem to come with it. Many people would question that or balk at it because, well after all, life is so busy and there's really not a lot of time for that 'Jesus'.

But maybe as we continue through our Easter cycle of celebration it's time to reexamine our dedication and commitment to following Jesus, our efforts to live a life worthy of the calling to which we have been called in our baptism. As scary as this all might sound, it also comes with a promise, a promise that we will be blessed, a promise that we will find the life we are looking for, a life that we unsuccessfully try to find in other things. As Devlyn Brooks said in his article in the Grand Forks Herald: "Maybe it is indeed past time that we as faithful people aimed to be disciples of Jesus, rather than only Christians. AMEN"

Running Slowly

At a track meet, we sat in the stands, cheering



for our son. I chuckled as a young sibling of an athlete asked, "Why are they running so slow, Mommy?"

These athletes had been training for years, and many were setting personal best times and even state records. Most spectators would provide little competition for the runners. But the child was comparing how he'd felt while running at the park, sprinting to a soccer game.

Along the track, dozens of teammates and coaches cheered. Each time an athlete passed, she heard strong, pointed encouragement. "You've got this!" "Someone's approaching; time to pick up the pace!" "Great stride — keep going!" The coaches and runners knew what was helpful and understood how hard the athletes were working.

My point: Consider who you allow to speak truth into your life. Do you listen to loved ones who "train" alongside you? Or do you give sideline critics too much space in your thoughts? Heed Proverbs 2:2 (NLT), which advises, "Tune your ears to wisdom, and concentrate on understanding."

A Prayer for Roots

The Language of Lament

Unlike nonbelievers, Christians can grieve with hope (see 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18). On Memorial Day and at Christian funerals and burials, our lament is real — and it's a uniquely Christian concept, according to Pastor Mark Vroegop. "It takes




faith to pray when you are in pain," he writes in *Dark Clouds, Deep Mercy*. "Belief in God creates challenging questions, and lament provides the opportunity to reorient your hurting heart toward what is true. But in order for that to happen, you have to turn to prayer. The silent treatment must end."

Vroegop, who had a stillborn daughter, says lament opens a door that leads to trust. Heartfelt lament, he says, can be brief or messy and can feel forced or uncomfortable. But the important thing is to "keep talking to God."

"Don't allow your fear, your despair or your track record of silence to cut off the flow of grace," he urges. "Your pain can be a path toward God if you'll allow lament to be your new language."

Aflame with Faith

In the Old Testament, fire often symbolizes the presence of God's Spirit. For example, God called to Moses from a burning bush (Exodus 3:2-6) and defeated the prophets of Baal on



Some Christians have described a burning or current-like sensation when they encounter God. Methodism founder John Wesley said his heart was "strangely warmed" during worship. After such an encounter, people often feel compelled to share the Good News of Jesus. The flame of faith inside one believer can spark a revival of faith in others. As Charles Spurgeon said, "A burning heart will soon find for itself a flaming tongue.

There was again discussion about other options for offering and Tithes was brought up by Pastor Beth as an option she has been introduced to that is made for churches. They range from \$2500 - \$5000 for a PTZ Camera (PTZ is a camera that can be moved and/or programed to move from a control station near the sound system controls while the service is happening)

John will bring quotes to the next meeting for possible replacements.

Directory for the 75th Anniversary has been planned. Picture will be self-taken and submitted. Can be put together on a service like Shutterfly. Kaye Furstenau has looked into it and started planning.


