## Yaounde, Cameroon Schedule is taking shape for our US visit


Every two years we travel to the United States in order to share stories about the work we are involved in and the experiences of our companion churches and organizations in Madagascar, West and Central Africa. We attend Summer Missionary Conference, attend some meetings and try to visit as many of the congregations that have committed to sponsoring us as we can. Planning is like doing a jigsaw puzzle: I like the challenge, but I also get frustrated and quit and come back to it later! Here I will share with you the draft schedule. Some of you are the contact people for your congregations and have been in touch. I hope you will look at this and let us know what you think. For others who haven't been in touch and might want to fit in to this schedule, let us know! We'll see what might be possible. For friends and family, we hope we get to see some of you as we travel around. We are also happy that we get to spend a week at Holden Village in Washington state for some continuing education. The week we will spend there we will also have a mini-reunion of some folks from Europe and the US who lived at a Lutheran retreat centre in England when my family did in the 80s.

For congregations that we will visit, we ask you to contribute to our travel expenses. I have tried to estimate mileage and a flight and the average cost to each congregation would be \$200. We don't want this to be a reason not to invite us if we are going to be in your area, so please do contact us anyway if you would be interested in seeing us. If you have been in touch, but don't see your congregation's name on this schedule, it might be because I am still trying to figure out how to arrange those visits, particularly for North Dakota and South Dakota. But you can always send a message as a reminder and even suggest a time based on this draft.

Joely and Solofo Rakotoarivelo of the Malagasy Lutheran Church, who, with support from the ELCA, have worked with the health system of the EELC for over 20 years. They will retire soon and will be greatly missed! We give thanks to God for their service and ask God's blessing as they return to Madagascar at the end of this year.
